

WARM-UP: (10 minutes)

As kids are arriving, some just before class starts and some right after, color the angel (On card stock. Template included). Once colored, tape straws to backside and let kids use a toothpick to help push string through the straws. Next, help them tie a bead to the ends. (I tied one bead onto one side ahead of time to help the kids out.) Tape the top of the string to the table and let kids make their angel "climb" to prepare them for the lesson of Jacob's vision. (See Video)

PRAYER: (5 minutes)

Help kids learn the value in talking to God. Ask for prayer requests. Write on the white board "Thank You" and "Please Help" – then, let the kids share their "thank you" and "please help" requests. Write them on the white board.

ASK KIDS:

- How God talks to us? (Through the bible and answering our prayers)
- How do we talk to God? (Prayer)

Remind them that we can't have a relationship with anyone, our friends or even parents, if we don't talk to them. It's important that we talk to God. He made us and no one can do the things he can, not even our moms and dads.

Lead kids in prayer.

BIBLE LESSON & ACTIVITY: (25 minute)

We learned last week that Abraham had a son named Isaac. Isaac married Rebekah and they had twin boys named Jacob and Esau. Esau gave Jacob his birthright for a bowl of stew! Now let's see what's next! We are still in Genesis. Is this in the Old or New Testament? OLD. And what does Genesis mean? Beginning.

Pass out Hands On Play Item (Play-Doh, Silly Putty, Kinetic sand)

- Make a kings crown. Just like earlier with Abraham, there wasn't much food in the land so Isaac went o Abimelech, King of the Philistines. God told Isaac, "Don't go to Egypt. Stay where I tell you and I will bless you just like I promised your father." What did God tell Isaac to do? Stay where He told him too. Remember, Isaac's wife was very beautiful. He was afraid the men in the place they were staying would kill him so they could have his wife; so, he told them Rebekah was his sister. Was that true? No.
- 2. **Make lips for kissing.** One day, the king looked out his window and saw Isaac hugging and kissing Rebekah, but not like a sister! He went to Isaac and said, "What have you done? You could have made us guilty." Isaac told him that he was afraid and the king gave orders that no one could hurt them.

- 3. **Make the number 100.** That year, Isaac planted crops in the land and gathered 100 times more than he planted. That was because the Lord blessed him and made him rich! He had so much wealth that it made the Philistines jealous. The Philistines kept filling Isaac's wells up with dirt. That's where his water came from. King Abimeleck told Isaac he was too powerful and made him move away.
- 4. **Dig wells in your play-doh or sand.** Isaac moved away and dug wells put the people their argued with them and said, "That's our water!" So Isaac moved again, dug another well and guess what. The people said, "That's our water!" So Isaac moved again and finally had land and a well to live. King Abimelech came to Isaac and said, "Clearly the Lord is with you. We want to make a peace treaty with you. You don't harm us and we won't harm you." So, Isaac made a peace treaty with King Abimelech, king of the Philistines.
- 5. **Make an eye.** Later, when Isaac had become very old, he couldn't really see anymore. One day he called for his son Esau. Isaac was ready to give Esau his blessing! He sent out to hunt for food.
- 6. **Make a hairy man. A body with lots of dots for the hairs or lots of tiny snakes for hair.** Rebekah heard this so she came up with a plan. She sent Jacob to get two of their goats while she prepared food. When Jacob returned, she had him put on his brother's best clothes. Then she covered his hands and neck with the goatskins so he'd be hairy like his brother. Finally, she sent him into his father.

"Father," Jacob said.

"Who is it?" asked Isaac.

Jacob lied, "It's your oldest son Esau. I've done as you asked."

"Come near me so I can touch you and know that it's really you, Esau."

7. **Make a "B" for blessing.** Jacob went close and his father felt the goat hair on his hands. Then Jacob gave him the food his mom had prepared. Finally, Isaac gave Jacob the blessing meant for Esau.

When Isaac finished blessing him, Jacob left his father. Then, Esau came in ready to serve his father and receive his blessing. When Isaac realized what had happened he began to shake all over. He told Esau he had already given away the blessing.

- 8. **Make a tear drop.** "Bless me! Bless me too, father!" Esau cried. But Jacob had tricked Isaac and he had the blessing. Isaac had just made Jacob ruler over his brother and all of their relatives would serve him. What could he give Esau?
- 9. **Make a big rock to use as a pillow.** Esau was so angry he wanted to kill his brother! Rebekah heard this so she sent Jacob to her brother's house. On the way, he got tired so he stopped for the night and used a stone for a pillow.
- 10. **Make or draw stairs in your play-doh or sand.** He had a dream. There was a stairway on the earth and the topped reached to heaven. Angels were going up and down it. The Lord stood beside it and said, I am the Lord, and then told Jacob he would give him all that he promised his grandfather Abraham. Jacob woke up and thought, "This is a holy place! This is the gate of heaven." So the next morning, Jacob took the stone and set it up as a *sacred* stone. Jacob made a promise to God.

Briefly review.

BOOKS OF THE BIBLE & SONGS: (5 minutes)

Sing the Old Testament books song and then the New Testament books songs.

Game: Bible Basketball.

Each child or set of kids will need to cups and a paper ball. Label one cup "Old" and the other "New"

Let kids set up cups on the table in front of them. You can decide how far away they should be. (Or you may line them up against the wall so there's a backdrop.)

Select a book of the bible. Have them tell you if the book is found in the Old or New Testament. Then, they can toss the "basketball" into the appropriate cup (this reinforces which part of the bible it's in so they are more likely to remember next time.) They can even keep their score if they'd like! Continue until class is over.

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(8) Treaty with Abimelech, Jacob Gets Blessing, Flees to Laban, Vision of Ladder Genesis 26-28 4th & 5th Grade



WARM-UP: (10 minutes)

As kids arrive, cut a piece of string and let them watch video to make Jacob's Ladder. It's okay if they don't get it because they'll have fun trying; however, most of the kids will be able to do this.

PRAYER: (5 minutes)

Help kids learn the value in talking to God. Ask for prayer requests. Write on the white board "Praise" – "Petition" – "Thanksgiving" – "Confession."

- Have kids give suggestions for **Praise** (ex: God is holy, amazing, awesome, our rock).
- Have kids give **Petitions** (needs/please help)
- Have kids give **Thanksgiving** (what are they thankful for)
- Remind them that in a public prayer, we typically pray that God forgives us, but we don't get specific in our **confessions**.
- Lead kids in prayer.

BOOKS OF THE BIBLE: (5 minutes)

Game: Bible Basketball. First person draws a book from the cup and reads to the class. They decided if it's in the Old or New Testament and race to find. Whoever finds it first gets a chance to make a basket in the appropriate basket for an extra point. Then, they chose the book. Continue (make sure to let each person have a turn making a basket). (You may use mini basketball net with balls for indoors-see Amazon or simply use two cups labeling Old and New along with a paper ball.)

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- 5. **Make an eye. Then read Genesis 27:1-4.** Isaac was ready to give Esau his blessing! He's the firstborn son so he is going to be put in charge.
- 6. **Read Genesis 27:5-6, 10:** Jacob's mom loved him most so when she heard this, she came up with a plan! She sent Jacob to get a couple of goats while she prepared a meal.
- 7. **Read Genesis 27:11-12:** What was Jacob worried about? Esau was hairy and if his father caught on, he was afraid his father would curse him. So, Jacob followed his mother's instructions and got the goats. She covered his hands and neck with the hair and sent him with the food she'd prepared.
- 8. **Read Genesis 27:18-22:** Isaac noticed something was off, his voice, but the hair convinced him. Later, Isaac smelled him and it even smelled like Esau because Jacob was wearing his clothes. Then, Isaac blessed Jacob who he thought was Esau. He gave him the earth's bounty and authority over his brother. He also promised that those who blessed Jacob would be blessed, and those who cursed him would receive a curse just like God's promise to Abraham in <u>Genesis 12:3</u>. When Isaac finished blessing him, Jacob left his father. Then, Esau came in ready to serve his father and receive his blessing.
- 9. **Read Genesis 27:33-34:** His dad was so angry that what happened? He shook all over. Could Isaac take the blessing back and give it to Esau. Apparently not. He said Jacob had "tricked" him and taken the blessing. And then we see Esau so upset he begs his father to bless him too.
- 10. How angry do you think Esau was? Let's see. **Read Genesis 27:4:** Rebekah heard this so she sent Jacob to her brother's house and gave Isaac a story so he blessed Jacob in this endeavor. On the way, he got tired so he stopped for the night and used a stone for a pillow.
- 11. Read Genesis 28:12-13: In this dream, this vision, God promises something to Jacob. He promised land to his children, promised that he'd have many, many family members, they'd be blessed and God would watch over Jacob. This was some dream! Jacob woke up and thought, "This is a holy place! This is the gate of heaven." So the next morning, Jacob took the stone and set it up as a *sacred* stone. Jacob made a promise to God. He promised that if God watched over him and returned him safely home that the Lord would be *his* God. And he promised he'd give God a 10th of everything God gave him.
